

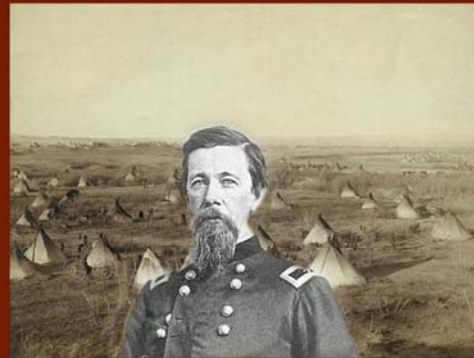
The UnCivil War at Whitestone Hill

Whitestone Hill. Driven into obscurity by the Battle of Gettysburg in 1863, this bloody clash rewrote the history of the Yanktonai Dakota Indians. It is the true story of a U.S. Cavalry invasion into Dakota Territory and the attack that shattered the lifestyle of the Indians living there. Told through the daily lives of both soldiers and Indians, it is a story too important to be forgotten.



The UnCivil War at Whitestone Hill recounts the long ignored story of the Dakota Indian-U.S. Cavalry conflict at Whitestone Hill in Dakota Territory in 1863. The fighting on the frontier occurred in the midst of the Civil War, just two months after the Battle of Gettysburg in Pennsylvania and two months before President Lincoln's unforgettable Gettysburg Address.

Told through the lives of four participants – an Indian girl, a Dakota warrior, an Iowa sergeant, and a Nebraska corporal – the book follows their paths for a full year prior to the bloody encounter that permanently altered the history of the Yanktonai Dakota Indians and of eastern Dakota Territory.
