Troop 22 Code of Conduct

The guiding principles of the Troop 22 rules of conduct are contained in the Scout Oath and The Scout Law. It is expected that every Scout will strive to follow these guidelines at all times.

All Scouts and adults will comply with the Boy Scouts of America rules and regulations as set forth in the "Guide to Safe Scouting" as well as in other publications, including the Troop 22 Policy Manual. Most of all, each Scout is expected to exercise good judgement and common sense.

Each Scout is expected to behave in a manner such that he will help advance the programs of Troop 22. Disruptive behavior will not be tolerated (ex: Fighting, stealing, foul language, any bodily injury intentionally inflicted on another scout, disrespect of other scouts or leaders, etc. This sort of behavior may result in immediate dismissal from the event.) Scouts are entitled to a program which is free of such behavior.

The Scoutmaster and all registered and unregistered leaders will enforce, and the Patrol Leaders council will actively support the "Code of Conduct" and policies of Troop 22. In general, a "Three Strikes and Your Out" policy will be followed. At the first inappropriate behavior, a Scout will be given a short time-out. At the second occurrence, the Scout will be told it is his second offense and will be given a longer time out. Finally, at the third occurrence, the boys parents will be called and the boy sent home. He must then bring his parent with him to the next meeting and campout. At the Scoutmaster or Campmasters discretion, a boy may be asked to leave after the first or second infraction, if warranted. The Scout's parents will then be responsible for picking the scout up at the activity.

Any Scout who chooses to continually disobey these "Rules of Conduct" may be dismissed from the Troop, at the discretion of the Troop Committee. This would only be after first being reprimanded as stated above.

The reading and signing of these rules and policies shall take place annually by each boy and adult during fall signup.
